
ART HISTORY - IMPRESSIONISM













ESSENTIAL KNOWLEDGE

- 19th-century art movement that uses relatively small, thin, yet visible brush strokes
- Emphasis on showing the changing qualities of light
- Impressionism originated with a group of Paris-based artists
- Came to prominence during the 1870s and 1880s.
- The Impressionists faced harsh opposition from the conventional art community in France
- The name of the style derives from the title of a Claude Monet work
- The development of Impressionism in the visual arts was soon followed by similar styles in other media that became known as impressionist music and impressionist literature

CLAUDE MONET

French painter, a founder of French Impressionist painting and the most consistent and prolific practitioner of the movement's philosophy

MARY CASSATT

Often created images of the social and private lives of women, with particular emphasis on the intimate bonds between mothers and children

ALFRED SISLEY

The most consistent of the Impressionists in his dedication to painting landscape en plein air (i.e., outdoors)

CONTEMPORARY ARTIST - ERIN HANSON

- Inspired by landscapes and vantage points only beheld by the most adventurous
- Watching the seasons and the light change daily across the desert, provides endless inspiration for her work
- Developed a unique, minimalist technique of placing impasto paint strokes without layering, which has become known as "Open-Impressionism"
- Transforms landscapes into abstract mosaics of colour
