
ART HISTORY - PHOTOREALISM

- Artists often project images onto canvas to allow them to be replicated with precision and accuracy
- The artists reintroduced the importance of planning over improvising
- The style marked a return to traditional techniques of academic art
- Male artist often used images of technology and machinery in their work

AUDREY FLACK

Achieved the photo-real effect by projecting, tracing and re-colouring real historical events onto over-sized canvases

CHUCK CLOSE

Became famous for his large-scale portraits. Globally renowned for reinvigorating the art of portrait painting after the dominance of photography

DUANE HANSON

Best known for his life-sized sculptures of solitary tourists, derelicts and housewives. His work explores social issues and American identity

CONTEMPORARY ARTIST - HILO CHEN

- Taiwanese-born American painter
- He is best known for his photorealistic paintings of the female figure
- Lives and works in New York
- His work is in major museum collections throughout the world including the Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum and the Taipei Fine Arts Museum
