HOW TO DO IT

- Take two photographs of a person in slightly differing poses
- Print your images out make sure they are both at least A4 sized
- Use a guillotine (or craft knife and ruler) to carefully cut your images into equal strips - make sure you keep your strips in order and seperate from each other
- On a new blank sheet of paper stick the strips back down; alternating from one image to the other
- With the strips you have left you should be able to make a second image


With his series "Urban Melodies" Trerotoli creates, by superimposing different pictures, an abstract representation of urban landscapes and contemporary life
