
ESSENTIAL KNOWLEDGE

- The artistic method of both Constructivism and Bauhaus embraced the idea of a new technology for a new world. T
- Their photography (like their art generally) was characterised by a precision and geometric simplicity that saw the artist assume the mantle of technician.
- Until 1929 the Bauhaus School used cameras simply for documentation purposes.
- Having established a dedicated photography school (within the advertising department) the Bauhaus developed a culture of avant-garde experimentation based on its aesthetic position.



EL LISSITSKY

Russian born artist, designer, typographer, photographer and architect who designed many exhibitions and propaganda for the Soviet Union in the early 20th century.

ALEXANDER RODCHENKO

Founding member of Russian Constructivism—the avant-garde movement characterized by unembellished abstraction— along with Vladimir Tatlin. He was known for his politically motivated photography, posters, paintings, and sculpture.

MAN RAY

American visual artist who spent most of his career in Paris. He was a significant contributor to the Dada and Surrealist movements, although his ties to each were informal.

CONTEMPORARY ARTIST - SERGE NAJJAR

- Born in Beirut and is a practicing lawyer there.
