ESSENTIAL KNOWLEDGE

- The first modern fashion shoot is attributed to Edward Steichen, who photographed gowns designed by Paul Poiret for the April 1911 issue of the magazine Art et Decoration.
- The field of fashion photography grew rapidly during the 1920s and '30s, with magazines such as Vogue and Harper's Bazaar leading the way.
- In the post-war period many photographers favoured a more spontaneous and energetic approach.
- The tension between art and commerce continues to drive creativity and innovation within the field.
