
FUTURISM









ESSENTIAL KNOWLEDGE

- The term was introduced by brothers Anton Giulio and Arturo Bragaglia.
- They used their camera to induce a sense of "visual vertigo" by creating photographic movement through multiple exposures.
- These early experiments in movement and portraiture more or less defined Futurist photography until the "Manifesto of Futurist Photography" in April 1930.
- This gave birth to a decade considered the most productive in Italian photographic arts.
- It was a decade that saw photography merge with other Futurist art forms.
