
REPLACING FACES - ERIN CASE

HOW TO DO IT

- From a hair or fashion magazine choose an image of a person
- Use a craft knife to carefully cut away all of the skin you can see
- Choose an image of a landscape to place behind the image and photograph your result
- Experiment with different images or surfaces behind your face photograph each idea and print out your results
- You could also use Photoshop to produce work like this - use YouTube to find out how to select and cut out parts of your image
